I have been elected as John's successor; and, with your help, I will do all I can to serve the interests of all the members of the Association.



Reactivation of the 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry: We had a nice turn out of Cav 5/7 veterans for the reactivation (reflagging) ceremony of the 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry Regiment at Fort Stewart, Georgia on July 21, 2004. The new Cav 5/7 is under the command of LTC Jody Petery.

It was great to see the 7th Cav colors flying in the wind under the bright Georgia sun as I sat in the shaded reviewing stand. This was the first formation that I have ever attended where I had a chair with my name on it in the reviewing stand. *(If the Generals only knew the real story about Pvt. "Krazy".)*

Hail & Farewell Dinner: The evening of July 21st, the new 5/7 had a "Hail & Farewell" dinner at Kevin Berry's Irish Pub on the river walk in Savannah, GA. 3rd Infantry Division Press Release Announcing the Reactivation of the 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry

1/3 ADA Inactivation - 5/7 Cavalry Activation Ceremony

Soldiers of the 3rd Infantry Division's, 1st Brigade, formally inactivate the 1st Battalion, 3rd Air Defense Artillery Wednesday, 9 a.m. in a ceremony at Cottrell Field. An activation ceremony of the 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment follows immediately.

The 5th Squadron*, 7th Cavalry Regiment was organized in 1866 at Fort Riley, Kan., and was inactivated at Fort Hood, Texas, in 1978. With its activation into the 3rd Infantry Division, the regiment resumes a long tradition of service to the nation. The Regiment fought in the Indian Wars (1866-1890); the Spanish-American War (1899-1902); the Philippine Insurgency (1904-1907 and 1911-1915); Occupation Forces, Japan (1945-1949); the Korean War (1950-1955); and Vietnam (1966-1971).

These ceremonies complete the reorganization of the division's 1st Brigade in concurrence

with the Army Chief of Staff's vision to create a more brigade unit of action focused organization.

The 3rd Infantry Division is the Army's first unit to convert to this modular design. Modularity provides rapid identification of units of action and packaging for short notice missions to meet the combatant commander's needs.

In addition, modularity provides greater readiness within the units of action, as the infantry, armor, cavalry, field artillery and support units train together at all times.

* *Subsequent to the press release it was decided the unit designation will be "Battalion" and not "Squadron".*


Veterans Day , November 11, 2004

IN MEMORIAM

Peter Howard, D5/7 '66-67, passed away on Sunday, September 5. He lost a long battle with cancer that had lasted the better part of 15 years. Then 2dLt Howard was the Battalion's first Recon Platoon Leader. He was a superb soldier and officer. Ted Swett represented the Association at Peter's funeral on September 10 in Middleberg, Virginia.

The following is a message to Pete from LTC Jody Petery the CO of the newly activated 5th Battalion 7th Cavalry.

Dear Trooper Howard (Pete),

I just wanted to introduce myself and report in on the progress that 5-7 Cavalry has made in re-establishing itself on the Army's rolls. You commanded a Recon PLT in the 5-7 Cav, and the Army has since seen the tremendous value of recon units, so now the entire Battalion is a recon element. 5-7 Cavalry today, has 4 ground recon troops (80 men strong) and a Headquarters Troop (250 men strong) which hosts the Staff, Medics, Mortars, Maintenance, Signal, Support (Cooks and Transporters), and Fire Supporters. The ground recon troops are our A-C Troops who each have 2 Bradley Fighting Vehicle Platoons, and a third platoon equipped with up-armored HMMWVs. Each of these platoons has between 15 and 20 soldiers, who's sole function is gathering intel. Our D Troop consists of 3 HMMWV platoons. This organization has some powerful sights, essentially the same power as those inside the Apache Helicopter, which allow us to see long distances both day and night.

Our Battalion has completed a National Training Center rotation at Fort Irwin CA where we first fought in a high-intensity environment, then fought in an environment which replicates Iraq today. This second portion was to prepare us for our December deployment to Iraq as part of OIF III. Our battalion will be controlling a sector around the city of Balad, northwest of Baghdad in the heart of the Sunni Triangle. It'll be a tough mission, and a tough fight with the insurgents who threaten the peace of Iraq, but our troopers will meet the challenge.

Just as our troops will meet the challenges in Iraq, we wanted to pass on our prayers and encouragement in your fight with melanoma. We want you to know that we're behind you, and will keep you in our prayers. If there's anything we can do or if we can provide any assistance, please allow us the honor. We have many officers in our unit from both West Point and the VA area, I'm the senior WP officer, from the Class of 86, but we have LTs from the Class of 2002 already serving here. We also have several folks from VA schools to include VA Tech and William and Mary. This unit has a fighting spirit, and is honored to carry on the traditions of 5-7 Cavalry.
