
especially enjoyed the expanding group of Iraqi Freedom Veterans who were able to join us.

union. This was a very difficult decision for all attending. But we have seen diminishing attendance in Washington, DC for


> years and we have not fulfilled our contractual obligations for rooms and meals since 2016.


Editor's Notes

Vietnam vet chooses to recall the good and forget the bad in new memoir

"Bullets in My Bottom Drawer" by John Montalbano ISBN: 979-8-8229-5085-6 Publication Date: October 1, 2024

Bullets in My Bottom Drawer is a compelling anthology of short stories that provides a unique lens into the Vietnam war. The author, a former member of the 5th Battalion, 7th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division shares his experiences from 1968, revealing the unexpected humor that often arose during the most dangerous situations. Rarely are the words war and laughter used together, but for Montalbano, in the words of James Bond, "Out of great danger often comes great humor."

The book draws comparisons to the popular TV series M.A.S.H., recounting the harrowing experiences, misadventures, and ordinary moments that often led to extraordinary events. It offers a firsthand look at the everyday life of a grunt, and how he and the brotherhood of men who served on the frontlines found humor and entertainment in an otherwise bleak existence. It will make you laugh, cry, and above all, appreciate the power of friendship, the resilience of the human spirit, and the ability to find laughter even in the darkest hours.
